

# DSWD DROMIC Report #13 on the Effects of Northeast Monsoon and Shear Line in Luzon

as of 26 February 2025, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 23 December 2024 at 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslide due to moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Visayas, Bicol Region, CALABARZON, and the rest of MIMAROPA. On the same day, several barangays in the Quezon Province experienced flooding due to Shear Line.


On 27 December 2024 at 4:00 AM, cloudy skies accompanied by rain showers, attributed to the Northeast Monsoon, resulted in moderate to at times heavy rainfall over the Cagayan Valley, the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), and Ilocos Norte. These conditions may have led to the possibility of flash floods and landslides. On the same day, several barangays in the municipalities of Baggao, Lal-lo, and Lasam in Cagayan, as well as the municipality of Flora in Apayao, experienced flooding due to Northeast Monsoon.

On 02 January 2025, cloudy skies with scattered rain and isolated thunderstorms, caused by the Shear Line, brought moderate to heavy rains over the provinces of Apayao, Cagayan, Isabela, and Aurora. These weather conditions may have resulted in flash floods and landslides. On the same day, several barangays in the municipality of Roxas in Isabela experienced flooding, while the municipalities of Banaue and Hingyon in Ifugao experienced landslides triggered by the Shear Line.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **8,153 families** or **28,440 persons** are affected in **59 barangays** in **Regions I, II, CALABARZON**, and **CAR** (see Annex A).



## **III.** Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **77 families** or **230 persons** sought temporary shelter in **six (6) Evacuation Centers** in **Region II** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **eight (8) families** or **38 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives (see Annex C).

## c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **85 families** or **268 persons** were displaced in **Regions II** and **CAR** (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 10 houses were damaged; of which, three (3) are totally damaged and seven (7) are partially damaged in CAR (see Annex E).

#### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}\$,111,023.35 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}\$6,603,323.35 from \$\mathbb{D}\$SWD and \$\mathbb{P}\$2,507,700.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).

- ₱3.30 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

- ₱31.08 million available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families.

## 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 412,323 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 177,583 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 234,740 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 472,091 FFPs available at FOs I, II, CALABARZON and CAR.
- 1,519,937 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the affected families.
