

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 26 February 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 20 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, Cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides in Visayas, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Caraga, Laguna, Rizal, and Quezon.

On the same day, continuous heavy rainfall was experienced in Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Albay and Masbate which caused localized flooding near river channels and in low lying areas.


Meanwhile, several municipalities in Agusan del Sur experienced flooding due to the continuous heavy rainfall resulting in the displacement of families and individuals in the community.

On 22 February 2025, the continuous rains brought by the effects of Shear Line caused flooding in some parts of Eastern Visayas.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **15,333 families** or **56,719 persons** are affected in **88 barangays** in **Regions V, VIII and Caraga** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **683 families** or **2,567 persons** sought temporary shelter in **26 evacuation centers** in **Regions V and Caraga** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **1,321 families** or **5,208 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **2,004 families** or **7,775 persons** were displaced in **Regions V, VIII and Caraga** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱323,330.74** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱252,640.74** from **DSWD** and **₱70,690.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).
