

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Libungan, North Cotabato

as of 20 February 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 17 February 2025 at 4:00 AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to Easterlies may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 7:00 PM, Brgy. Baguer and Brgy. Gumaga in Libungan, North Cotabato experienced flash floods due to heavy rains caused by Easterlies.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **956 families** or **2,163 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Libungan, North Cotabato** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or three (3) persons are temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B)

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of three (3) houses were damaged; of which, one (1) is totally damaged and two (2) are partially damaged in Libungan, North Cotabato (see Annex C).
