

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 27 February 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 20 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides in Visayas, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region, Caraga, Laguna, Rizal, and Quezon.

On the same day, continuous heavy rainfall was experienced in Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Albay, and Masbate which caused localized flooding near river channels and in low-lying areas. Meanwhile, continuous heavy rainfall was experienced in several municipalities in Agusan del Sur which led to a flooding incident resulting in the displacement of families and individuals in the area.

On 21 February 2025, flooding incidents were experienced in the municipality of Brooke's Point, Palawan due to the continuous heavy rainfall brought by the effects of Shear Line.

On 22 February 2025, continuous rainfall brought by the effects of Shear Line was also experienced and caused flooding in some parts of Eastern Visayas.


II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 17,393 families or 63,905 persons are affected in 107 barangays in Regions MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and Caraga (see Annex A).









III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **892 families** or **3,021 persons** sought temporary shelter in **29 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **V**, and **Caraga** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **3,000 families** or **11,461 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **3,892 families** or **14,482 persons** were displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **V**, and **Caraga** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}1,775,409.78\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}1,704,719.78\$ from \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}70,690.00\$ from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex E).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.30 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱9.08 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and Caraga.
- ₱34 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 415,023 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 170,283 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 244,740 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 494,201 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and Caraga.
- 1,518,291 FFPs in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Shear Line through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱948.07 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, V, VIII, and Caraga warehouses.

27 February 2025	 The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) closely coordinates and collaborates with DSWD FOs and other relevant DSWD Offices/Bureaus/Sections/Units to monitor and oversee the release of FFPs to the LGUs intended for distribution to the families affected by the effects of Shear Line. The DRMB maintains close coordination with DSWD FOs to receive timely disaster response updates concerning the impacts of the Shear Line. The DRMB collaborates closely with the Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration to obtain significant weather updates and related information regarding the Shear Line's effects. The DRMB, through the DSWD Disaster Response Command Center, closely coordinates with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center and other concerned offices for significant updates and other related information regarding the effects of Shear Line. The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as the need arises.
