

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Flooding Incidents due to Shear Line as of 11 February 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

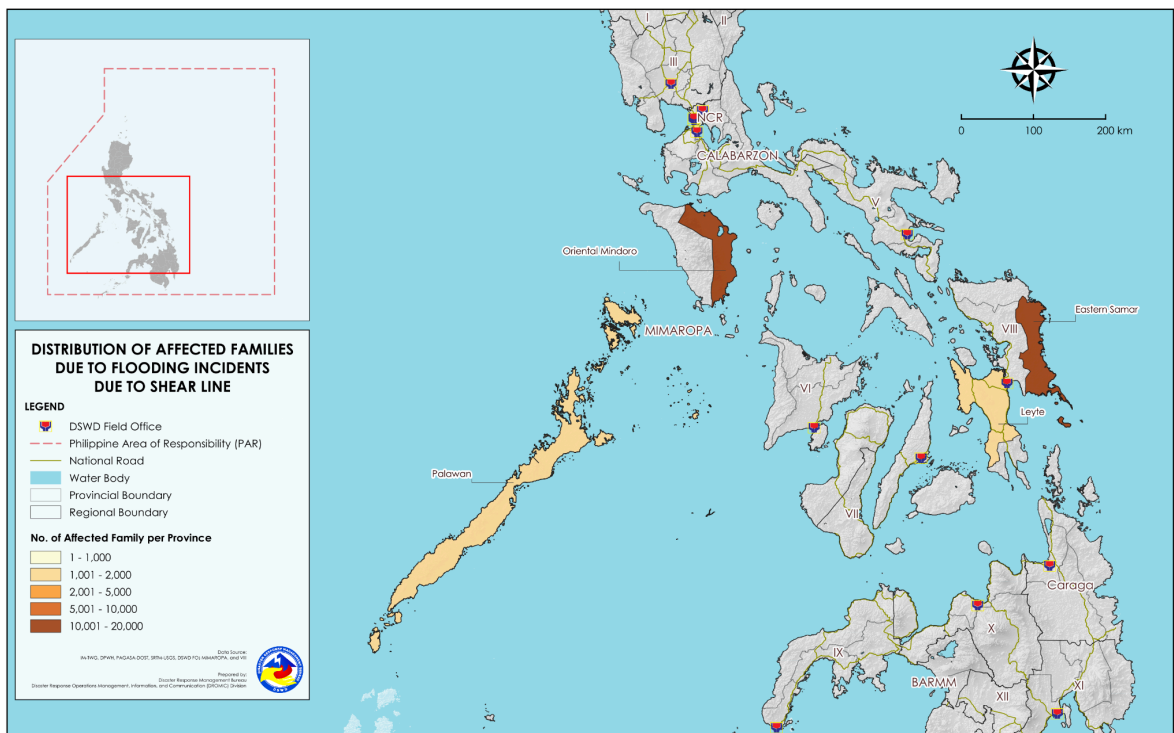
On the same day, several municipalities in Eastern Samar experienced flooding due to Shearline.

On 08 February 2025 until the following day, flooding incidents were experienced in several low-lying areas in the municipalities of Baco, Calapan City, Naujan, Socorro and Victoria in Oriental Mindoro, and Aborlan and Narra in Palawan due to continuous rainfall caused by Shear Line. These incidents led to the displacement of the families residing in the low lying areas and near the river and lake side.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **34,692 families** or **120,381 persons** are affected in **195 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA** and **VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **2,223 families** or **8,804 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **59 evacuation centers** in **Region MIMAROPA** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **586 families** or **2,345 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **2,809 families** or **11,149 persons** still displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱575,129.80** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱550,129.80** from **DSWD** and **₱25,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex E).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.30 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA and VIII.
- ₱38 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the flooding incidents through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 440,138 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 206,156 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 233,982 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 208,544 FFPs available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA and VIII.

- 1,684,053 FFPs in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the flooding incidents through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.01 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VIII warehouses.
