

## DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Flooding Incidents due to Shear Line as of 11 February 2025, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 06 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

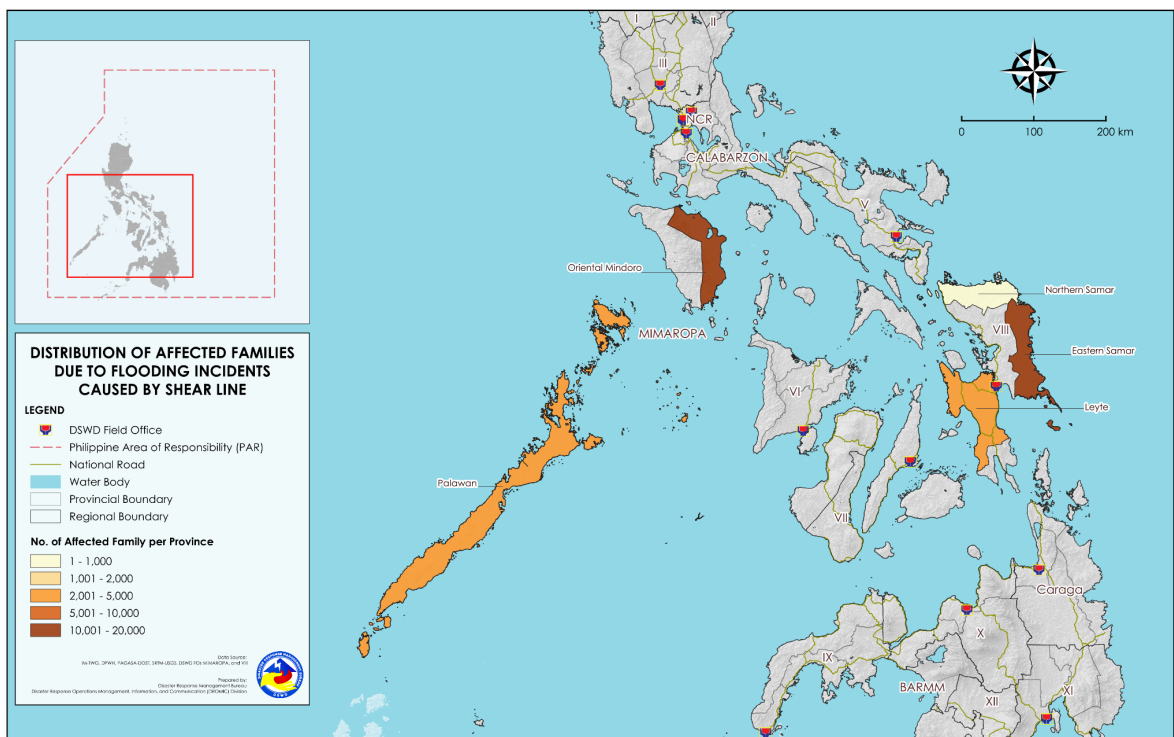
On the same day, several municipalities in Eastern Samar experienced flooding due to Shearline.

On 08 February 2025 until the following day, flooding incidents were experienced in several low-lying areas in the municipalities of Baco, Calapan City, Naujan, Socorro and Victoria in Oriental Mindoro, and Aborlan and Narra in Palawan due to continuous rainfall caused by Shear Line. These incidents led to the displacement of the families residing in the low lying areas and near the river and lake side.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **37,706 families** or **133,934 persons** are affected in **216 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA** and **VIII** (see Annex A).



### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **2,603 families** or **10,187 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **72 evacuation centers** in **Region MIMAROPA** and **VIII** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **620 families** or **2,451 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **3,223 families** or **12,638 persons** still displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **two (2) houses** were damaged; of which, **one (1)** is **totally damaged** and **one (1)** is **partially damaged** in **Region VIII** (see Annex E).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,969,710.80** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱615,810.80** from **DSWD**, **₱2,445,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, **₱908,900.00** from the **other Partners** (see Annex F).
