

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Shear Line**

as of 12 February 2025, 6AM

## I. Situation Overview

On 06 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

On the same day, several municipalities in Eastern Samar experienced flooding due to Shear Line.

Further, continuous heavy rainfall was also experienced in Bicol Region that resulted in a landslide incident in Legazpi City and caused localized flooding in several areas.


On 08-09 February 2025, flooding incidents were experienced in MIMAROPA Region, particularly in several low-lying areas in the municipalities of Baco, Calapan City, Naujan, Socorro and Victoria in Oriental Mindoro, and Aborlan and Narra in Palawan, due to continuous rainfall caused by Shear Line. These incidents led to the displacement of the families residing in the low-lying areas and near the river and lake side.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **43,319 families** or **156,796 persons** are affected in **293 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, V and VIII (see Annex A).





### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **3,357 families** or **12,892 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **102 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA**, V and VIII (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **692 families** or **2,704 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **4,049 families** or **15,596 persons** still displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **V** and **VIII** (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of five (5) houses were damaged; of which, three (3) are totally damaged and two (2) are partially damaged in Regions V and VIII (see Annex E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱8,408,781.34 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱5,054,881.34 from DSWD, ₱2,445,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU), ₱908,900.00 from the other Partners (see Annex F).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱3.30 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱7.37 million available at DSWD FOs MIMAROPA, V and VIII.
- ₱35 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the flooding incidents through inter-FO augmentation.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 452,138 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 218,156 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 233,982 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.

- 1,597,273 FFPs in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the flooding incidents through inter-FO augmentation.
