

## DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on the Mw 5.9 Earthquake Incident in Southern Leyte as of 11 February 2025, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

On 23 January 2025 at around 7:39 AM, a 5.9-magnitude earthquake jolted the Province of Southern Leyte (10.00°N, 125.19°E, 007 km S 29° E).

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,451 families** or **8,462 persons** were affected in **67 barangays** in **Southern Leyte** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

### Outside Evacuation Center

There are **16 families** or **64 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **970 houses** were damaged; of which, **23** are **totally damaged** and **947** are **partially damaged** in **Southern Leyte** (see Annex C).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱1,696,514.08** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families (see Annex D).
