

# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. BF Homes, Parañaque City

as of 18 March 2025, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 12 March 2025, a fire broke out at Aratiles II, Masville, Barangay BF Homes, Parañaque City. The fire began at 4:15 PM and was declared under control at 9:59 PM. According to the initial report from the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Parañaque City, through its City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO), 137 families, comprising 464 individuals, were affected by the incident.

Relative to the incident, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office in the National Capital Region (NCR), actively participated in the response operations and maintained ongoing coordination with the LGU of Parañaque City for significant updates and potential requests for relief augmentation.

There are **137 families** or **464 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Masville Elementary School** in **Brgy. BF Homes, Parañaque City** (see Annex B).

A total of **50 houses** were **totally damaged** in **Brgy. BF Homes, Parañaque City** (see Annex C).
