

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Suspected Monkeypox Cases in Bauko, Mountain Province as of 17 March 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On February 3, 2025, the Bauko Municipal Health Office (MHO) was notified by the Provincial Health Office (PHO) of two suspected M-pox cases in the region. Both individuals tested negative for M-pox after undergoing quarantine. The first case involved a 27-year-old male who completed a three-week home quarantine. The second individual, who was admitted to Luis Hora Regional Hospital, also completed his quarantine. Despite the negative test results, both were advised to continue medication and remain in home quarantine until their conditions improved and they completed the required three-week quarantine period.

The quarantine had social and economic impacts, requiring affected individuals and their families to temporarily suspend daily activities. In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) through its Field Office in the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR), provided relief assistance to support the immediate needs of the affected families/individuals.

A total of **two (2) families** or **seven (7) persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Bauko, Mountain Province** (see Annex A).

III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided
