

DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 26 May 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms, caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao, Eastern Visayas, and Palawan. On the same day, a flooding incident occurred in Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ. Meanwhile, families in Lanao del Norte who had undertaken pre-emptive evacuation due to heavy rain had already returned to their respective homes.

On 16 May 2025, several low-lying barangays in Ampatuan, Maguindanao del Sur experienced flash floods due to continuous heavy rain brought by the ITCZ. On 17 May 2025, several barangays in the municipality of Kumalarang, Zamboanga del Sur, experienced flooding and landslides while flooding incidents were also reported in the municipalities of Shariff Aguak and Shariff Saydona Mustapha in Maguindanao del Sur.

On 18 May 2025 at around 1:00 AM, persistent flooding occurred in the provinces of Sarangani, Sultan Kudarat, and Maguindanao del Sur. On the same day, a strong wind incident was also reported in Tantangan, South Cotabato.

On 19 May 2025 at around 8:00 PM, flooding incidents occurred in Brgy. Bunawan, Davao City and in the municipality of Datu Abdullah Sangki, Maguindanao del Sur, both attributed to prolonged rainfall associated with the ITCZ.

On 21 May 2025, heavy rains continued to pour in several barangays in the municipality of Malapatan, Sarangani, as well as in the municipalities of Sultan Sa Barongis and Talayan in Maguindanao del Sur that resulted in flooding in the affected areas.


On 23 May 2025, ITCZ continued to affect SOCCSKSARGEN causing flash floods in the municipalities of Carmen and Pikit in North Cotabato, and Lebak and Kalamansig in Sultan Kudarat.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **57,647 families** or **176,962 persons** are affected in **143 barangays** in **Regions IX**, **X**, **XI**, **XII**, and **Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao** (**BARMM**) (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,564 families** or **4,836 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **13 evacuation centers** in **Regions IX, XII,** and **BARMM** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,732 families** or **6,617 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population
 There are 3,296 families or 11,453 persons still displaced in Regions IX, XI, XII, and BARMM (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **119 houses** were damaged; of which, **29** are **totally damaged** and **90** are **partially damaged** in **Regions IX**, **X**, and **XII** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of P4,010,085.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, P3,905,085.00 from DSWD, and P105,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex G).
