

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on the Effects of Easterlies**

as of 03 March 2025, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 13 January 2025 at 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain showers and thunderstorms were observed, attributed to the Easterlies. These conditions may have led to potential flash floods or landslides, with moderate to heavy rainfall affecting Palawan.

On the same day, the municipalities of Sofronio Española and Brooke's Point in Palawan experienced flooding due to the heavy rains brought by the Easterlies.


On 14 January 2025, at around 2:00 PM, heavy rainfall associated with the Easterlies resulted in flooding and significant drainage overflow in Barangay Basiawan, Sta. Maria, Davao Occidental.

On 15 January 2025, continued heavy rainfall from the same weather disturbance caused flooding, prompting the evacuation of families in the City of Tandag, Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur, and Rosario, Agusan del Norte.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **22,498 families** or **100,563 persons** are affected in **71 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, XI,** and **Caraga** (see Annex A).





### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **267 families** or **813 persons** sought temporary shelter in **10 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, XI,** and **Caraga** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **145 families** or **585 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

A total of 412 families or 1,398 persons displaced in Regions MIMAROPA, XI, and Caraga (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **33 houses** were damaged; of which, **17** are **totally damaged** and **16** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI** and **Caraga** (see Annex E).

#### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}\$15,553,803.84 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}\$15,537,638.70 from \$\mathbb{D}\$SWD and \$\mathbb{P}\$16,165.14 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).
