

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #128 on Kanlaon Volcano Eruption**

as of 02 March 2025, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

- As of 02 March 2025, Kanlaon Volcano remains under Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest). This means that magmatic unrest could generate similar ash emission and even short-lived explosive eruptions in the short term which may generate life-threatening volcanic hazards. It is recommended that communities within a 6-km radius from the summit crater remain evacuated due to the danger of pyroclastic density currents (PDCs), ballistic projectiles, ashfall, rockfall and other related hazards. Local Government Units (LGUs) must continue to prepare their communities within the PDC hazard zone for subsequent evacuation in case unrest further escalates and hazardous worst-case explosive eruption becomes imminent. Increased vigilance against potential syn-eruption lahars and sediment-laden streamflows in channels draining the edifice is strongly advised should intense rains occur during eruptive unrest. Civil aviation authorities must also advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit as ash from any sudden eruption can be hazardous to aircraft.
- On 15 February 2025 at 2:32 PM, an episode of significant emission occurred from the summit crater of Kanlaon Volcano. The emission lasted for eight (8) minutes based on the seismic record and generated a plume that rose 1,500 meters above the crater before drifting to the west-northwest. Ashfall and sulfurous smells were reported in several localities of Bago City, Negros Occidental.
- On 11 January 2025 at 1:00 PM, a pronounced inflation or swelling of the middle to upper portion of the eastern edifice was observed. Electronic tilt was recorded at 1,056 m elevation on the eastern flank of the volcano showing an abrupt and sharp increase in inflationary tilt since 10 January 2025, indicating a sudden pressurization within the upper portions of the edifice. The overall parameters may indicate that the shallow magma conduit of the volcano is undergoing pressurization that may lead to an eruption.
- On 23 December 2024 at 12:30 PM, an increase in volcanic ash emission at the Kanlaon Volcano was observed. At 11:45 AM, dark ash has been issuing from the summit of Kanlaon Volcano accompanied by a weak low frequency volcanic earthquake. This has produced a dark plume roughly 1.2 kilometers tall that is drifting to the northwest. Ash emission has been ongoing and ashfall is expected to fall over communities of Negros Occidental northwest to west of the volcano. All other parameters of the volcano remain elevated but are generally unchanged.
- On 09 December 2024 at 3:03 PM, Alert Level 3 was raised from Alert Level 2 over the Kanlaon Volcano after an explosive eruption that occurred at the summit vent. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 3,000 meters above the vent and drifted west-southwest. PDCs descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.








The raising of the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest) means that a magmatic eruption has begun and may progress to further explosive eruptions. All LGUs are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **12,630 families** or **48,528 persons** are affected in **27 barangays** in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex A).



# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 2,625 families or 8,388 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 22 evacuation centers in Regions VI and VII (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are 3,124 families or 10,066 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **5,749 families** or **18,454 persons** are still displaced in **Regions VI** and **VII** (see Annex F).



### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱209,378,443.67 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱107,078,343.84 from DSWD, ₱30,392,293.59 from the Local Government Units (LGUs), ₱33,451,112.24 from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and ₱38,456,694.00 from other Partners (see Annex G).
