

DSWD DROMIC Report #13 on the Effects of Shear Line

as of 13 March 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 16 February 2025, at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms, attributed to Shear Line, brought potential flash floods or landslides to Aurora and the northern portion of Quezon.

On the same day, several barangays in the municipalities of Cagayan and Isabela experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by the Southwest Monsoon.

On 20 February 2025, continuous heavy rainfall in Camarines Norte, Camarines Sur, Catanduanes, Albay, Masbate, and Quezon resulted in localized flooding near river channels and low-lying areas. Furthermore, sustained rainfall in several municipalities of Agusan del Sur led to flooding, displacing families and individuals in the affected areas.

On 21 February 2025, various reports of flooding incidents in Brooke's Point, Palawan were reported due to the continuous heavy rainfall brought by Shear Line.

On 22 February 2025, continuous rainfall brought by the effects of Shear Line was experienced and caused flooding in some parts of Eastern Visayas.


On 23 February 2025, continuous heavy rain was also experienced in Brgy. Rizal, San Carlos City, Negros Occidental and caused landslide incident brought by Shear Line.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **88,303 families** or **288,194 persons** are affected in **291 barangays** in **Regions II, MIMAROPA, V, VI, VIII,** and **Caraga** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of six (6) families or 25 persons are currently taking temporary shelter in Brgy. Pangabugan Covered Court in Region Caraga (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **570 families** or **2,294 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **576 families** or **2,319 persons** were displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA**, **V**, **VI**, and **Caraga** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **37 houses** were damaged; of which, **four (4)** are **totally damaged** and **33** are **partially damaged** in **Region VI**, **and Caraga** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}14,980,485.09\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of \$\mathbb{P}14,765,012.29\$ from \$\mathbb{D}SWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}215,472.80\$ from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex H).

13 March 2025	 The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) closely coordinates and collaborates with DSWD FOs and other relevant DSWD Offices/Bureaus/Sections/Units to monitor and oversee the release of FFPs to the LGUs intended for distribution to the families affected by the effects of Shear Line. The DRMB maintains close coordination with DSWD FOs to receive timely disaster response updates concerning the impacts of the Shear Line. The DRMB collaborates closely with the Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration to obtain significant weather updates and related information regarding the Shear Line's effects. The DRMB, through the DSWD Disaster Response Command Center, closely coordinates with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center and other concerned offices for significant updates and other related information regarding the effects of Shear Line. The National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as the need arises.
