

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Shear Line in Eastern Visayas as of 21 March 2025, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 19 March 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Eastern Visayas, Sorsogon, Masbate, Aklan, and Capiz.

On the same day, due to the continuous heavy rainfall caused by Shear Line, a landslide incident occurred at San Miguel-Babatngon Road, San Miguel, Leyte.

Meanwhile, a flooding incident also occurred at the Wright-Taft-Borongon Road, Brgy. Malinao, Taft. Both incidents led to impassable roads.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **28,582 families** or **98,805 persons** are affected in **165 barangays** in **Region VIII** (see Annex A).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **167 families** or **519 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **15 evacuation centers** in **Region VIII** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,498 families** or **5,769 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **1,665 families** or **6,288 persons** still displaced in **Region VIII** (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **three (3) houses** were damaged; of which, **two (2)** are **totally damaged** and **one (1)** is **partially damaged** in **Pinabacdao, Western Samar** (see Annex E).
