

DSWD DROMIC Report #28 on the Effects of Shear Line as of 21 April 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 06 February 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Visayas, Catanduanes, Albay, Sorsogon, Masbate, Romblon, Dinagat Islands, and Surigao del Norte.

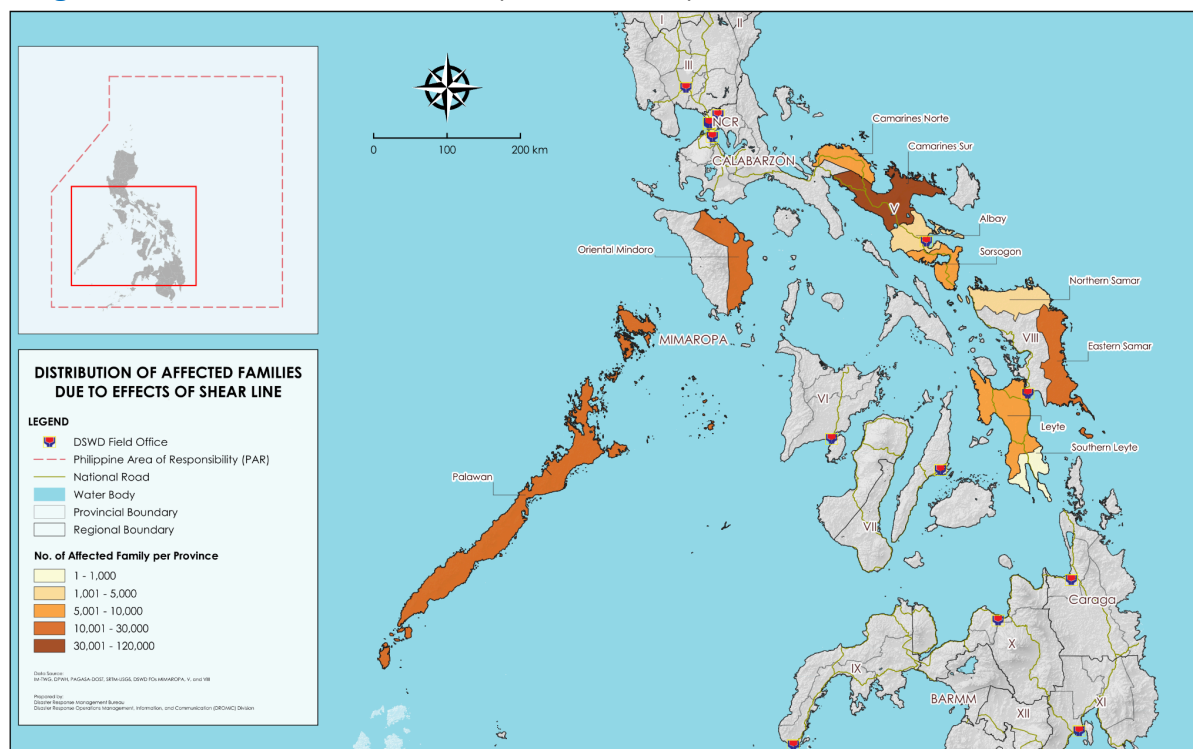
On the same day, several municipalities in Eastern Samar experienced flooding due to the Shear Line. Further, continuous heavy rainfall was also experienced in the Bicol Region which resulted in a landslide incident in Legazpi City and caused localized flooding in various areas.

On 08-09 February 2025, flooding incidents were experienced in the MIMAROPA Region, particularly in several low-lying areas in the municipalities of Baco, Calapan City, Naujan, Socorro and Victoria in Oriental Mindoro, and Aborlan and Narra in Palawan, due to continuous rainfall caused by Shear Line. These incidents led to the displacement of the families residing in the low-lying areas and near the river and lakeside.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **202,656 families** or **821,763 persons** are affected in **1,154 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, and VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **3,980 families** or **14,479 persons** sought temporary shelter in **182 evacuation centers** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, and VIII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **26,484 families** or **95,328 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

A total of **30,464 families** or **109,807 persons** displaced in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, and VII** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **416 houses** were damaged; of which, **107** are **totally damaged** and **309** are **partially damaged** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V and VIII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱129,578,350.94** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families composed of **₱89,023,137.11** from **DSWD**, **₱38,685,536.83** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱757,782.00** from the **Non-Government Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱1,111,895.00** from **other Partners** (see Annex F).
