

DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Shear Line in Visayas

as of 26 March 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 19 March 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms caused by Shear Line may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Eastern Visayas, Sorsogon, Masbate, Aklan, and Capiz.

On the same day, due to the continuous heavy rainfall caused by Shear Line, a landslide incident occurred at San Miguel-Babatngon Road, San Miguel, Leyte.

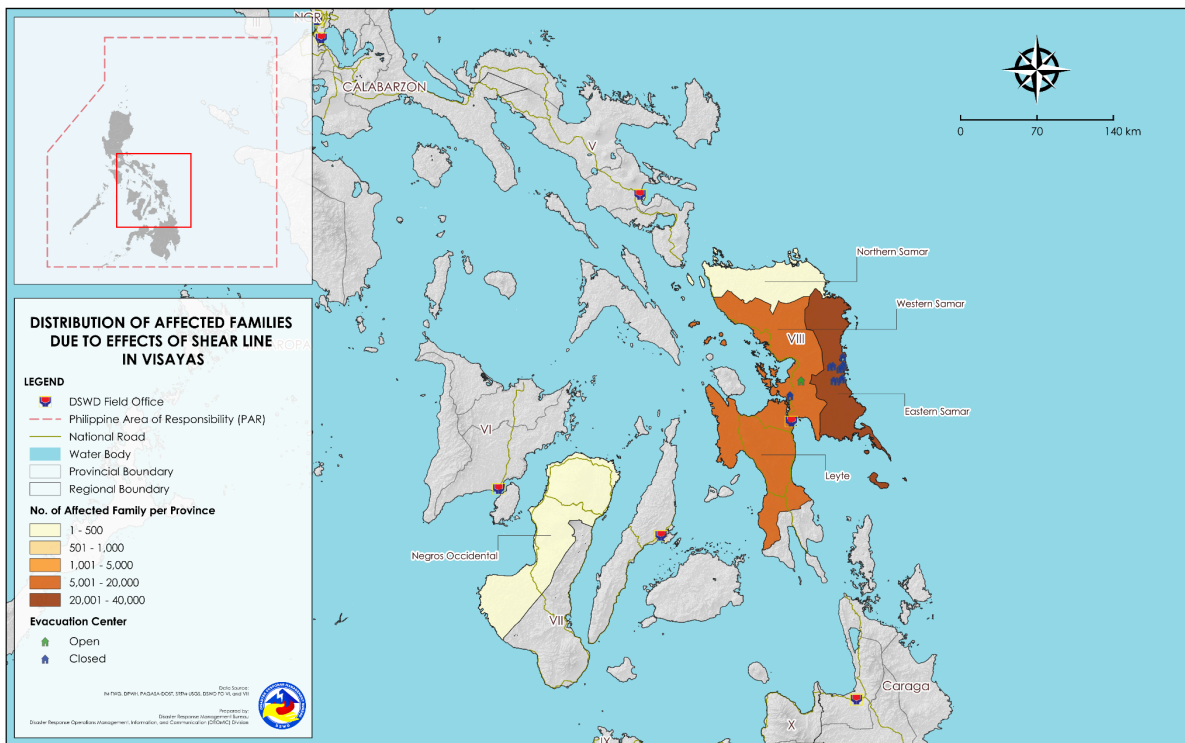
Meanwhile, a flooding incident also occurred at the Wright-Taft-Borongon Road, Brgy. Malinao, Taft. Both incidents led to impassable roads.

On the other hand, at around 10:00 in the evening, heavy rain accompanied by strong winds due to Shear line was also experienced in Brgy. 10, Victorias City in Negros Occidental.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **50,902 families** or **179,220 persons** are affected in **291 barangays** in **Region VI** and **VIII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **11 families** or **47 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Region VIII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **13 families** or **52 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **24 families** or **99 persons** still displaced in **Region VIII** (see Annex F).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **16 houses** were damaged; of which, **14 are totally damaged** and **two (2) are partially damaged** in **Region VI** and **VIII** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱24,913,939.32** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families, of which **₱24,912,439.32** from **DSWD** and **₱1,500.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex H).

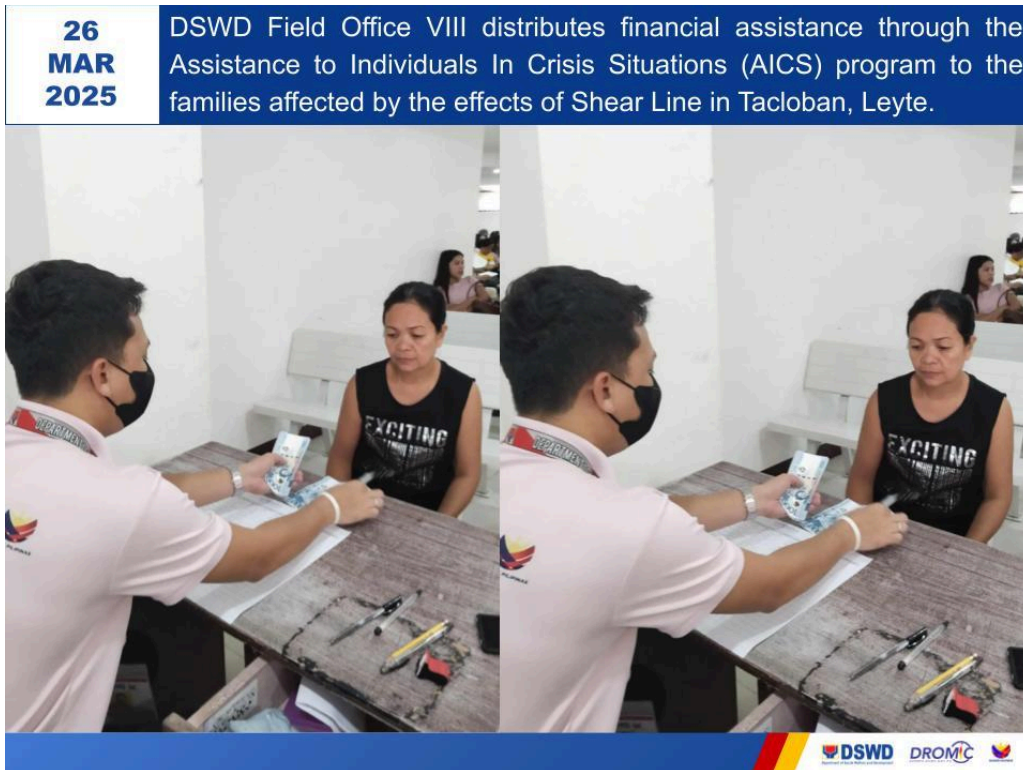
