

# DSWD DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report #6 on the Observance of Semana Santa 2025

as of 18 April 2025, 6AM

#### **Situation Overview**

As the Asian country with the highest population of Christianity, the Philippines annually commemorates the "Semana Santa" or Holy Week, a week-long celebration of Jesus Christ's sacrifice on the cross for the salvation of His people from sin and His gift of everlasting life. The observation starts on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday – the day where we celebrate Christ's resurrection from the dead. The whole week is observed in solemnity, with Holy Thursday and Good Friday declared as official holidays pursuant to Proclamation No. 727¹, issued on 30 October 2024 by the Office of the President. As such, it is common that Filipinos begin to take leave from school or work as early as Holy Monday and lasting the entire week.

During this time, the majority of the Filipinos join the rush to go home to their respective hometowns and provinces to spend this holy festivity together with their families. Consequently, an increase in the volume of people is expected in transport stations such as bus terminals and air and sea ports, which amplifies their vulnerability to human-induced disasters. Naturally, we also cannot rule out the possibility of the occurrence of disasters due to natural hazards during this period.

#### **Weather Bulletin**

Issued on 18 April 2025 at 4AM, Easterlies are affecting the country. Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to Easterlies may cause possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms over Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

### Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpile and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱2,928,077,244.61 with breakdown as follows (see Table 1):

#### a. Standby Funds

A total of ₱101,330,424.69 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, ₱53,330,424.69 is the available Quick Response Fund (QRF) in the CO.

#### b. Stockpiles

A total of 2,764,363 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱1,893,501,886.55, other food items amounting to ₱67,705,371.35, and non-food items amounting to ₱865,539,562.02 are available.
