

# **DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Bulusan Volcano Eruption**

as of 28 April 2025, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview


- As of 28 April 2025 at 7:00 AM, the alert status of Bulusan Volcano was raised from Alert Level 0 (Normal) to Alert Level 1 (Low-level Unrest), which means that the volcano is currently in a state of low-level unrest with chances of phreatic eruptions succeeding this morning's event.
- On 28 April 2025 at 4:36 AM, a phreatic eruption occurred from the summit crater of Bulusan Volcano and lasted 24 minutes based on seismic and infrasound records. The event produced a bent plume that rose 4,500 meters above the crater before drifting west to southwest. Ashfall was reported in Brgys. Cogon and Bolos, Irosin, Brgys. Puting Sapa, Guruyan, and Buraburan, Juban, and Brgy. Tulatula Sur, Magallanes, Sorsogon Province. A pyroclastic density current (PDC) or "uson" descended the southwestern slopes and travelled within three (3) kilometers from the summit vent. Prior to the eruption, a total of fifty-three (53) volcanic earthquakes were recorded over the 24-hour period yesterday. Rumbling sounds were reported by local government officials approximately 15 minutes before the eruption and were recorded by infrasound sensors.
- Local government units and the public are reminded that entry into the 4-kilometer radius Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ) must be strictly prohibited and that vigilance in the 2-kilometer Extended Danger Zone (EDZ) on the southeast sector must be exercised due to the possible impacts of volcanic hazards such as PDCs, ballistic projectiles, rockfall, avalanches and ashfall on these danger areas. Communities that experience ashfall must take all necessary precautions and use protective masks or wet cloth to prevent ash inhalation.
- Civil aviation authorities must also advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit as ash from any sudden phreatic eruption can be hazardous to aircraft. Furthermore, people living within valleys and along river/stream channels especially on the southeast, southwest and northwest sector of the edifice should be vigilant against sediment-laden stream flows and lahars in the event of heavy and prolonged rainfall should phreatic eruption occur.
- On 21 April 2025 at 10:00 PM, a notice of increased seismic activity at Bulusan Volcano was released. A total of ninety-eight (98) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Bulusan Volcano Network (BVN) since 3:00 AM of 12 April 2025. Of these, ninety-four (94) were weak and shallow volcano-tectonic (VT) earthquakes produced by rock fracturing and four (4) were low frequency volcanic earthquakes (LFVQ) produced by movement of fluids. The volcanic earthquakes were generated within 20 kilometers depth beneath the Bulusan edifice with nearly half being shallow events. In contrast, degassing activity at the summit crater and active vents has been very weak to moderate for the same period. The slight increase in volcanic earthquake activity could be caused by hydrothermal activity, which could lead to short-term pressurization of the edifice.
