

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in Bohol

as of 17 April 2025, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

On 15 January 2025, an outbreak of African Swine Fever (ASF) was first reported in the Municipality of Danao, Bohol. Affected families experienced substantial financial losses due to the culling of infected animals and severely disrupting local hog production.

On 7 March 2025, the Municipality of Buenavista detected ASF in Barangay Bantuan. In response, a localized lockdown was implemented to prevent further transmission, recognizing ASF is highly contagious in nature among domestic and wild pigs. Despite containment efforts, the ASF continues to spread. The municipalities of Buenavista, Carmen, Pilar, San Miguel, Trinidad and Ubay have also reported ASF cases, thus, sought financial assistance from the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Social Welfare and Development - Bohol Satellite Office, to support the affected hog raisers.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease that affects domestic and wild pigs, with a mortality rate that can reach 100%. While it does not pose a threat to human health, it has devastating effects on pig populations and the agricultural economy. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials.

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,352 persons** are affected in **61 barangays** in **Bohol** (see Annex A).

### III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱5,341,324.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected persons; of which, **₱5,331,324.00** from **DSWD** and **₱10,000.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex B).
