

DSWD DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report #6 on the 2025 National and Local Elections

as of 14 May 2025, 6AM

Situation Overview

As mandated by Republic Act (RA) No. 7166, "An Act Providing For Synchronized National and Local Elections and for Electoral Reforms, Authorizing Appropriations Therefor, and For Other Purposes," the next synchronized National and Local Elections (NLE) will happen on the second Monday of May, the 12th, in the year 2025. Likewise, pursuant to RA No. 9369, the May 2025 NLE will again be fully automated, as it was with the May 2010 NLE, 2013 NLE, 2016 NLE, 2019 NLE, and May 2022 NLE.

The Office of the President declared 12 May 2025 as a special (non-working) holiday throughout the country pursuant to Proclamation No. 878, s. 2025. It was issued to enable the people to properly exercise their right to vote. This also means a three-day long weekend since 12 May 2025 falls on a Monday.

As the country conducts the 2025 NLE, the Philippines is set to undertake a major democratic exercise on 12 May 2025. This extensive electoral process is expected to spark a large-scale movement of citizens across the country. During this time, the majority of the Filipinos are expected to join the rush to go home to their respective hometowns and provinces to exercise their votes. Consequently, an increase in the volume of people is expected in transport stations such as bus terminals, airports, and seaports, which amplifies their vulnerability to human-induced disasters. Naturally, we also cannot rule out the possibility of the occurrence of natural disasters during this period.

Finally, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) issued Memorandum No. 109, s. 2025 to amend the memorandum previously issued regarding the raising of Blue Alert Status in relation to the 2025 NLE on 12 May 2025, from 09 to 14 May 2025. This adjustment is to provide a longer lead time to closely monitor, consolidate, and ensure prompt coordination with concerned agencies and offices.

Weather Bulletin

Issued on 14 May 2025 at 4AM, the easterlies is affecting the country. Cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms due to the easterlies may cause possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains over Southern Leyte, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental, and Davao Occidental. Meanwhile, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to easterlies may cause flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms over Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpile and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), National Resource Operations Center (NROC), and Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to ₱2,953,313,290.02 with breakdown as follows (see Table 1):

a. Standby Funds

A total of **P71,519,455.03 standby funds** in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **P23,519,455.03** is the available **Quick Response Funds (QRF)** in the CO.

b. Stockpiles

A total of 2,981,906 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱2,010,483,596.04, other food items amounting to ₱15,230,542.00, and non-food items (FNIs) amounting to ₱856,079,696.95 are available.
