

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental

as of 18 May 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025 at 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao, Eastern Visayas, and Palawan.

On the same day, a flooding incident was experienced in Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental, due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ.

Meanwhile, families who had undertaken pre-emptive evacuation due to heavy rains in the province of Lanao del Norte have already returned to their respective homes.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **200 families** or **1,167 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

There are **200 families** or **1,167 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **200 houses** were damaged; of which, **33** are **totally damaged** and **167** are **partially damaged** in **Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental** (see Annex C).
