

DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on the Structural Vulnerabilities of the San Juanico Bridge

as of 28 May 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) imposed a temporary maximum gross vehicle weight limit of three (3) metric tons on all vehicles crossing the San Juanico Bridge, which connects the provinces of Leyte and Samar. This measure is being implemented due to identified structural vulnerabilities in the bridge.

The restriction on vehicle types allowed to cross the San Juanico Bridge may significantly impact economic activities, delay the delivery of essential services and commodities, and disrupt daily operations, affecting many individuals who depend on this crucial route.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 1,936 families or 2,006 persons are affected in Regions V and VIII (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **11 families** or **58 persons** sought temporary shelter at the **Matnog Public Auditorium** in **Matnog, Sorsogon** (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P1,224,174.80** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families and individuals (see Annex E).

1. Standby Funds

26 May 2025	DSWD FO VIII Regional Director participated in the Regional Inter-Agency Coordinating Cell (RIACC) – Task Force San Juanico meeting to deliberate on the current situation concerning the San Juanico Bridge restriction.
25 May 2025	DSWD FO VIII remains on high alert at Help Desks in Leyte and Samar to assist stranded individuals.

24 May 2025	DSWD FO VIII attended the coordination and planning meeting held at San Francisco, Leyte, in response to stranded truckers in Ormoc City.
23 May 2025	 DSWD FO VIII deployed its Mobile Command Center to monitor and gather updates on the stranded families and individuals. DSWD FO VIII, in coordination with the Municipal Action Team (MAT) in Sta. Rita, Samar, continued to administer the profiling and validation of the stranded families and individuals through the use of Family Access Card in Emergencies and Disasters (FACED).
22 May 2025	DSWD FO VIII referred the stranded families and individuals to the Crisis Intervention Section for further assessment and provision of financial assistance (FA) through the Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situation (AICS).
