

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 01 May 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 April 2025 at 4:00 AM, the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) is affecting Mindanao. Cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains.

On the same day, several barangays in Mawab, Davao de Oro, and Jose Abad Santos, Davao Occidental, experienced flooding and landslides due to continuous heavy rainfall brought about by the prevailing ITCZ.

On 27 April 2025 at around 1:00 PM, a flash flood incident was also experienced in Brgy. Napnapon, Palimbang, Sultan Kudarat due to continuous heavy rains caused by ITCZ.

On 29 April 2025 at around 4:30 PM, several barangays experienced a flash flood in Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **373 families** or **1,441 persons** are affected in **Regions XI** and **XII** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

There are **75 families** or **259 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **14 houses** were damaged; of which, **four (4)** are **totally damaged** and **10** are **partially damaged** in **Davao Region** (see Annex C).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱70.24 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD Field Offices (FOs) XI and XII.
- ₱42 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 703,627 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 388,069 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 315,558 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 204,937 FFPs available at DSWD (FOs) XI and XII.
- 1,933,043 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) through inter-FO augmentation.
