

# DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 19 May 2025, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao, Eastern Visayas, and Palawan. On the same day, a flooding incident was experienced in Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ.

Meanwhile, families who had undertaken pre-emptive evacuation due to heavy rains in the province of Lanao del Norte have already returned to their respective homes.


On May 17, 2025, several barangays in the municipality of Kumalarang, Zamboanga del Sur experienced flooding and landslide incidents due to the ITCZ.

On 18 May 2025 at 1AM, continuous rainfall brought by the ITCZ also caused flooding in Brgy. Baluntay, Alabel, Sarangani.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,516 families** or **6,194 persons** are affected in **Regions IX**, **X**, and **XII** (see Annex A).





# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### **Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **1,422 families** or **5,724** persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

# IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **205 houses** were damaged; of which, **34** are **totally damaged** and **171** are **partially damaged** in **Regions IX** and **X** (see Annex C).

## 1. Standby Funds

- ₱24.84 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) available at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱9 million available at DSWD FOs IX, X, and XII.
- ₱39 million available in other FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.

## 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 783,534 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 409,973 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 373,561 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 291,194 FFPs available at DSWD FOs IX, X, and XII.
- 1,910,813 FFPs are available in other FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱867.55 million worth of other FNIs available at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs IX, X, and XII warehouses.
