

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 21 May 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview


On 15 May 2025 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao, Eastern Visayas, and Palawan. On the same day, a flooding incident was experienced in Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ. Meanwhile, families who had undertaken pre-emptive evacuation due to heavy rains in the province of Lanao del Norte have already returned to their respective homes.

On May 17, 2025, several barangays in the municipality of Kumalarang, Zamboanga del Sur experienced flooding and landslides due to the ITCZ. In other parts of Mindanao, flooding occurred in Brgy. Baluntay, Alabel, Sarangani on 18 May 2025 at 1AM, and in Brgy. Bunawan, Davao City on 19 May 2025 at 8PM, both caused by continuous rainfall brought by the ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,936 families** or **7,211 persons** are affected in **Regions IX**, **X**, **XI**, and **XII** (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,358 families** or **5,301 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **105 houses** were damaged; of which, **19** are **totally damaged** and **86** are **partially damaged** in **Regions IX** and **X** (see Annex C).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱1,057,495.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱952,495.00 from DSWD, and ₱105,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex D).
