

# DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) and Low Pressure Area (LPA)

as of 05 May 2025, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

Issued on 26 April 2025 at 4 AM, the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) was affecting Mindanao. Cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains.

On the same day, several barangays in Mawab, Davao de Oro; and Jose Abad Santos, Davao Occidental, experienced flooding and landslides due to continuous heavy rainfall brought about by the prevailing ITCZ.

On 27 April 2025 at around 1 PM, a flash flood incident was also experienced in Brgy. Napnapon, Palimbang, Sultan Kudarat due to continuous heavy rains caused by ITCZ.

On 29 April 2025 at around 4:30 PM, several barangays experienced a flash flood in Bagumbayan, Sultan Kudarat due to continuous heavy rainfall brought by ITCZ.

On 30 April 2025 at around 1:30 PM, continuous heavy rain resulted in flash flood and landslide experienced in the Municipality of Maitum in Sarangani, Ampatuan and Shariff Aguak in Maguindanao del Sur caused by ITCZ.

On 01 May 2025 at around 4:30 PM, heavy rain and strong wind was also experienced in Tacurong City caused by ITCZ.


On 02 May 2025 at around 2 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms brought by the combined effects of low-pressure area (LPA) and ITCZ caused flash floods in Pikit, Cotabato Province.

On 03 May 2025 at around 5:30 PM, continuous rainfall brought about by the effects of LPA resulted in flooding in Brgy. IV and V, San Carlos City, Negros Occidental. Source: DOST-PAGASA Daily Weather Bulletin and DSWD Field Offices (FOS)



## II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **5,083 families** or **18,207 persons** are affected in **42 barangays** in **Regions VI**, **XI**, **XII**, and **Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao** (**BARMM**) (see Annex A).



## III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **195 families** or **649 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Regions XI** and **XII** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **three (3) families** or **16 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population
 There are 198 families or 665 persons still displaced in Regions XI and XII (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **33 houses** were damaged; of which, **seven (7)** are **totally damaged** and **26** are **partially damaged** in **Regions XI**, **XII**, and **BARMM** (see Annex E).



## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,170,870.20 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱2,165,870.20 from DSWD and ₱5,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).

### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱58.04 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) available at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱9 million available at DSWD FOs VI, XI and XII.
- ₱39 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.

- 354,009 FFPs available at DSWD FOs VI, XI and XII.
- 1,801,442 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱936.77 million worth of other FNIs available at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
