

DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Structural Vulnerabilities of the San Juanico Bridge

as of 24 May 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) imposed a temporary maximum gross vehicle weight limit of three (3) metric tons on all vehicles crossing the San Juanico Bridge, which connects the provinces of Leyte and Samar. This measure is being implemented due to identified structural vulnerabilities of the bridge.

The restriction on the types of vehicles allowed to cross the San Juanico Bridge may significantly impact economic activities, delay the delivery of essential services and commodities, and disrupt daily operations, affecting many people who depend on this crucial route.

A total of **1,000 families** or **1,110 persons** are affected in **Regions V** and **VIII** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **11 families** or **58 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at **Matnog Public Auditorium** in **Matnog, Sorsogon** (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱534,757.95** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families and individuals (see Annex E).
