

DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Mindanao

as of 23 May 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025 at 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms, caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Mindanao, Eastern Visayas, and Palawan. On the same day, a flooding incident occurred in Brgy. Nangcaon, Opol, Misamis Oriental due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ. Meanwhile, families in Lanao del Norte who had undertaken pre-emptive evacuation due to heavy rain had already returned to their respective homes.

On 16 May 2025, several low-lying barangays in Ampatuan, Maguindanao del Sur experienced flash flood due to continuous heavy rain brought by the ITCZ.

On May 17, 2025, several barangays in the municipality of Kumalarang, Zamboanga del Sur experienced flooding and landslides due to the ITCZ. On the same day, heavy rains caused by ITCZ also caused flooding in the municipalities of Shariff Aguak and Shariff Saydona Mustapha, Maguindanao del Sur.


In other parts of Mindanao, flooding occurred in Brgy. Baluntay, Alabel, Sarangani on 18 May 2025 at 1AM, and in Brgy. Bunawan, Davao City on 19 May 2025 at 8PM, both caused by continuous rainfall brought by the ITCZ.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **45,205 families** or **138,903 persons** are affected in **128 barangays** in **Regions IX**, **X**, **XI**, **XII**, and **Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao** (**BARMM**) (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **1,039 families** or **3,189 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **10 evacuation centers** in **Regions XII** and **BARMM** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **1,632 families** or **6,117 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **2,671 families** or **9,306 persons** still displaced in **Regions IX**, **X**, **XII**, and **BARMM** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **116 houses** were damaged; of which, **29** are **totally damaged** and **87** are **partially damaged** in **Regions IX**, **X**, and **XII** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,157,413 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱2,052,413.00 from DSWD, and ₱105,000.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).

- ₱324.45 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) available at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱12 million available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, and XII.
- ₱34.78 million available in other FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 766,734 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 401,573 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 365,161 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 415,745 FFPs available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, and XII.
- 1,771,114 FFPs are available in other FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱868.31 million worth of other FNIs available at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, and XII warehouses.
