

DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Structural Vulnerabilities of the San Juanico Bridge

as of 25 May 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) imposed a temporary maximum gross vehicle weight limit of three (3) metric tons on all vehicles crossing the San Juanico Bridge, which connects the provinces of Leyte and Samar. This measure is being implemented due to identified structural vulnerabilities in the bridge.

The restriction on vehicle types allowed to cross the San Juanico Bridge may significantly impact economic activities, delay the delivery of essential services and commodities, and disrupt daily operations, affecting many individuals who depend on this crucial route.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 1,248 families or 1,337 persons are affected in Regions V and VIII (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are **11 families** or **58 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at **Matnog Public Auditorium** in **Matnog, Sorsogon** (see Annex B).

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P781,677.10** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families and individuals (see Annex E).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱324.45 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) available at the DSWD Central Office.
- 6 million available at DSWD FOs V and VIII.
- ₱40.78 million available in other FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Structural Vulnerabilities of the San Juanico Bridge through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items
