

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms and Easterlies in Davao Region

as of 20 June 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 12 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, the Department of Science and Technology–Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA) weather advisory indicated partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to localized thunderstorms. These conditions had the potential to cause flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in the rest of the country.

On 13 June 2025 at around 3:00 AM, several barangays in Sta. Maria, Davao Occidental experienced flash floods and landslides due to intense rains brought by localized thunderstorms.

On the same day, flooding was also experienced in the Municipality of Malalag, Davao del Sur due to intense rains brought by localized thunderstorms. Furthermore, the Municipality of Jose Abad Santos in Davao Occidental experienced flooding and landslides due to continuous intense rainfall.

On 17 June 2025, the Municipalities of Santo Tomas and Talaingod, Davao del Norte experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rainfall caused by Easterlies.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **4,512 families** or **17,877 persons** are affected in **29 barangays** in **Davao Region** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **36 families** or **172 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Davao Region** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **33 families** or **84 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex E).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **36 families** or **172 persons** still displaced in **Davao Region** (see Annex F).



IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **20 houses** were damaged; of which, **10** are **totally damaged** and **10** are **partially damaged** in **Davao Region** (see Annex G).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱3,583,244.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱3,554,434.00** from **DSWD** and **₱28,810.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex H).

15 June 2025	The LGU of Santa Marie, Davao del Norte provided hot meals to the displaced families and persons.
