

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Agricultural Drought in Cordillera Administrative Region

as of 19 June 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

From February to March 2025, due to little to no rainfall, an agricultural drought struck the municipalities of Danglas and La Paz in Abra, as well as the Municipality of Paracelis in Mountain Province.

This prolonged dry spell led to extreme drought conditions in several barangays, causing widespread agricultural losses, the depletion of water sources vital for crop irrigation, and a severe disruption of farmers' livelihoods. Many families, who rely heavily on farming as their primary source of income and sustenance, were left vulnerable. Consequently, they experienced food insecurity and were in urgent need of assistance.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office Cordillera Administrative Region (FO CAR), together with the affected Local Government Units (LGUs) in the region, promptly provided relief assistance to address the immediate needs of the affected communities.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 6,647 families or 28,491 persons are affected in 20 barangays in CAR (see Annex A).

III. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱6,645,391.70 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱605,341.70 from DSWD and ₱6,040,050.00 from the LGUs (see Annex B).
