

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in City of Valencia, Bukidnon as of 26 June 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 21 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms, caused by Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), might have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains in Zamboanga Peninsula, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, Davao Region, and Negros Island Region.

On the same day, several barangays in the City of Valencia, Bukidnon experienced flash floods and landslides due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ.
