

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Strong Wind Incident in Brgy. Switch, Tapaz, Capiz as of 11 June 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On 02 June 2025 at around 4PM, strong winds were experienced in Brgy. Switch, Tapaz, Capiz, destroying a residential structure and displacing a family, who have since sought temporary shelter with their relatives.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

One (1) family or **six (6) persons** are affected in **Brgy. Switch, Tapaz, Capiz** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Outside Evacuation Center

One (1) family or **six (6) persons** are temporarily staying with their relatives while slowly rebuilding their house (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

One (1) house was **totally damaged** in **Brgy. Switch, Tapaz, Capiz** (see Annex C).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱4,272.00** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected family (see Annex D).
