

# DSWD DROMIC Report #13 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Low Pressure Area (LPA)

as of 20 June 2025, 6AM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 05 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) might have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in the rest of Visayas and Mindanao. On the same day, some low-lying barangays in Aleosan, North Cotabato experienced a flash flood due to heavy rains brought by the trough of the LPA.

On 06 June 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon might have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon. On the same day, at around 3:00 PM, a flash flood occurred in several barangays in San Jose del Monte, Bulacan. Furthermore, a landslide caused by the LPA occurred in Brgy. Tagbaros, Maco, Davao de Oro.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by the combined effects of the Southwest Monsoon and LPA.

On 10 June 2025, several barangays in Cagayan de Oro City experienced flash floods and landslides due to light to moderate rainfall caused by the Southwest Monsoon.

On the same day, strong winds occurred in Brgy. Bunga, Salvador Benedicto, Negros Occidental, caused by the Southwest Monsoon.


### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 5,859 families or 19,645 persons are affected in 46 barangays in Regions III, VI, IX, X, XI, and XII (see Annex A).









## III. Status of Displaced Population

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **164 families** or **486 persons** are currently taking temporary shelter at the **basketball court** in **Brgy. 24**, **Cagayan de Oro City** (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **three** (3) families or 10 persons temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **167 families** or **496 persons** still displaced in **Regions IX** and **X** (see Annex D).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **702 houses** were damaged; of which, **one (1)** is totally damaged and **701** are **partially damaged** in **Regions III**, **VI**, **IX**, and **X** (see Annex E).

### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}\_2,185,569.00\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}\_2,150,684.00\$ from \$DSWD\$ and \$\mathbb{P}\_34,885.00\$ from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Annex F).
