

# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) in Bukidnon

as of 27 June 2025, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

On 21 June 2025, at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms, caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), may have brought flash floods or landslides due to moderate to, at times, heavy rains in the Zamboanga Peninsula, Caraga, Northern Mindanao, Davao Region, and Negros Island Region.

On the same day, several barangays in the City of Valencia, Bukidnon experienced flash floods and landslides due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ.

On 25 June 2025, Malaybalay City also reported flooding and landslide incidents affecting seven (7) of its barangays, attributed to the same weather condition. Source: DOST-PAGASA Daily Weather Bulletin and DSWD Field Office (FO) X

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,883 families** or **7,862 persons** are affected in **12 barangays** in **Bukidnon** (see Annex A).

## III. Damaged Houses

A total of four (4) houses were partially damaged in Bukidnon (see Annex B).

# IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **32,400.00** worth of assistance was provided by the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** to the affected families (see Annex C).
