

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Low Pressure Area (LPA) in Mindanao as of 09 June 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 05 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the Trough of Low Pressure Area (LPA) may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in the rest of Visayas and Mindanao.

On the same day, some low-lying barangays in Aleosan, Cotabato Province, experienced a flash flood due to heavy rains brought by the trough of LPA.

On 06 June 2025 around 3:00 PM, a landslide caused by LPA also occurred in Brgy. Tagbaros, Maco, Davao de Oro, affecting 335 individuals.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Offices (FOs) XI and XII, is closely coordinating with the Local Government Units (LGUs) of Maco, Davao de Oro and Aleosan, North Cotabato, for any updates and requests for resource augmentation to support the affected individuals.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **248 families** or **975 persons** are affected in **five (5) barangays** in **FO XI** and **XII** (see Table 1).

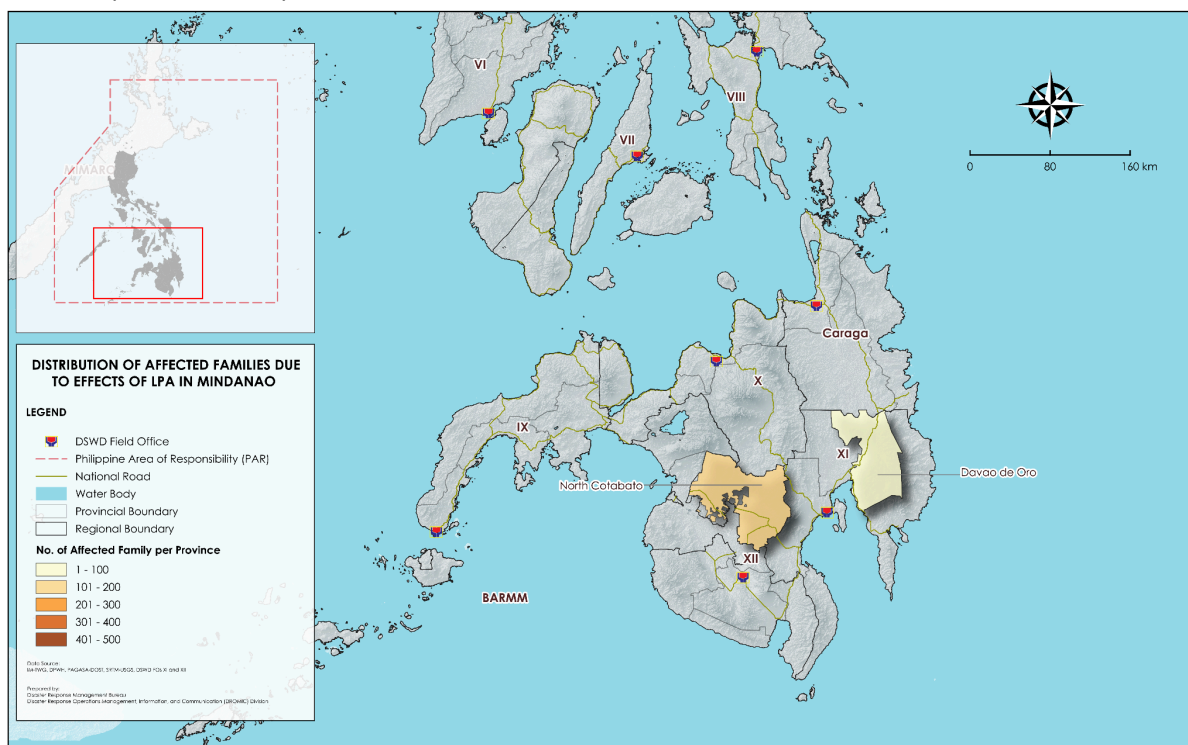

1. Standby Funds

- ₱268.83 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FO XI and XII.
- ₱41.02 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of LPA through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 735,302 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 427,794 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 307,508 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 240,508 FFPs available at DSWD FOs XI and XII.
- 2,002,056 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of LPA through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱949.13 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs XI and XII warehouses.
