

# DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon

as of 08 June 2025, 6AM

# I. Situation Overview

Issued on 06 June 2025 at around 4AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon.


On the same day, at around 3PM, a flashflood incident occurred which affected several barangays in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by Southwest Monsoon.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **565 families** or **2,191 persons** are affected in **13 barangays** in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex A).





# III. Status of Displaced Population

# a. Inside Evacuation Center There are 359 families or 1,366 persons currently taking temporary shelter in 8 evacuation centers in Regions III and IX (see Annex B).

#### b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **206 families** or **825 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

#### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **565 families** or **2,191 persons** still displaced in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex D).

### IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 65 houses were partially damaged in Regions III and IX (see Annex E).

# V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱285,210.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱250,965.00 from DSWD and ₱34,245.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).
