

# DSWD DROMIC Report #24 on the Structural Vulnerabilities of the San Juanico Bridge

as of 16 June 2025, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2025, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) implemented a temporary restriction limiting the maximum gross vehicle weight to three (3) metric tons for all vehicles crossing the San Juanico Bridge, a critical infrastructure connecting the provinces of Leyte and Samar. This precautionary measure was undertaken following the identification of structural vulnerabilities in the bridge, which prompted urgent safety interventions.

With San Juanico Bridge serving as the main access point in and out of Tacloban City, the imposed weight limit has severely disrupted economic activities, hampered the delivery of medical supplies and other essential commodities, and delayed emergency response operations. These impacts have placed significant strain on daily life and local governance in the city.

In response to the restriction's adverse effects on the flow of goods, services, and people, the City Government of Tacloban declared a state of emergency on 23 May 2025. The decision was made in accordance with Section 16 of the Local Government Code and pertinent national disaster risk protocols, which authorize local government units to declare a state of emergency when public safety is compromised, or when immediate action is necessary to address disruptions in essential services.

The DSWD, through its Field Office VIII and Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB), continues to monitor the situation and stands ready to provide augmentation support as needed to affected LGUs in the region.

A total of **2,743 families** or **2,813 persons** are affected in **Regions V** and **VIII** (see Annex A).

## III. Status of Displaced Population

#### **Inside Evacuation Center**

A total of **287 families** or **334 persons** sought temporary shelter in **three (3) evacuation centers** in **Region V** (see Annex B).

#### IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P1,709,512.95** worth of assistance was provided by **DSWD** to the affected families and individuals (see Annex C).
