

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon

as of 08 June 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 06 June 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon.


On the same day, at around 3:00 PM, a flashflood incident occurred which affected several barangays in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 828 families or 3,259 persons are affected in 15 barangays in Regions III and IX (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are 393 families or 1,710 persons currently taking temporary shelter in eight (8) evacuation centers in Regions III and IX (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **165 families** or **620 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **558 families** or **2,330 persons** still displaced in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 65 houses were partially damaged in Regions III and IX (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P502,570.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **P468,325.00** from **DSWD** and **P34,245.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱268.83 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FOs III and IX.
- ₱41.02 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.







2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 749,502 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 436,294 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 313,208 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 451,687 FFPs available at DSWD FOs III and IX.
- 1,788,259 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱217.19 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FOs III and IX warehouses.
