

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon

as of 09 June 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 06 June 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon.

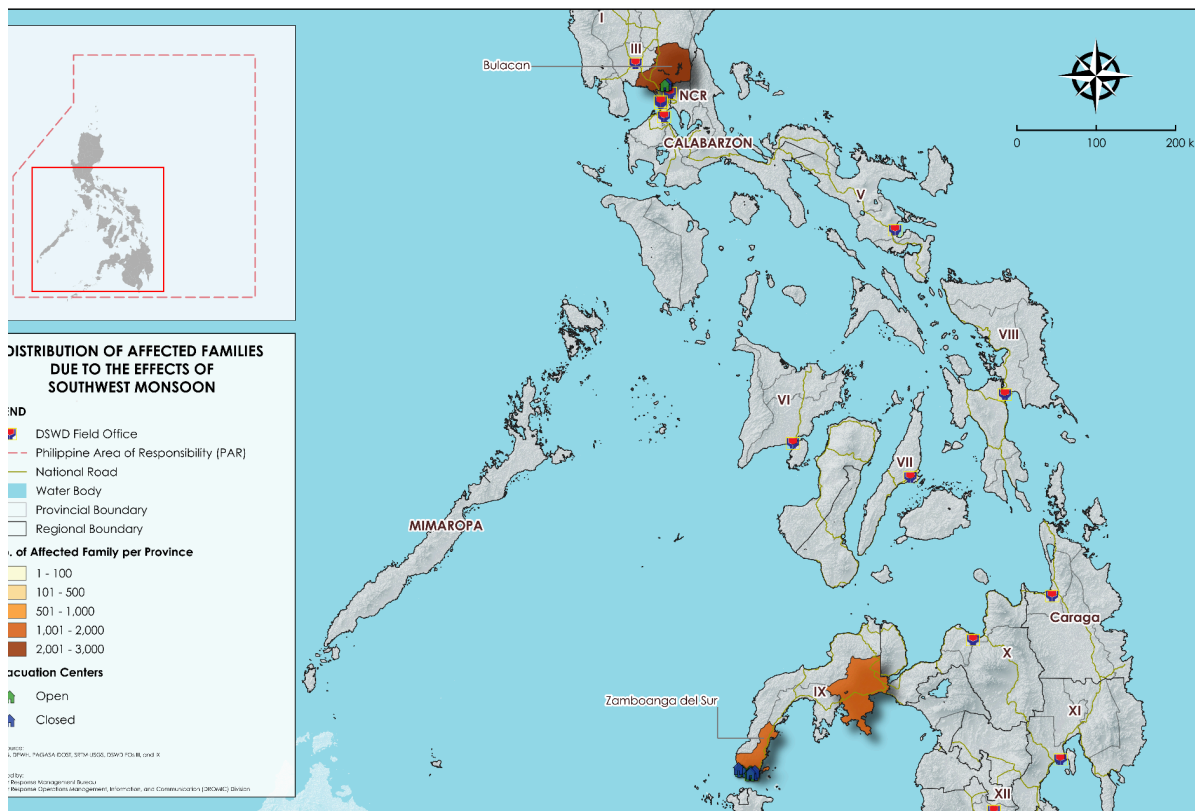
On the same day, at around 3:00 PM, a flashflood incident occurred which affected several barangays in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **3,801 families** or **12,950 persons** are affected in **32 barangays** in **Regions III and IX** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **651 families** or **2,561 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **six (6) evacuation centers** in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **41 families** or **205 persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **651 families** or **2,561 persons** still displaced in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **65 houses** were **partially damaged** in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱583,365.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱549,120.00** from **DSWD** and **₱34,245.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex G).
