

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in SOCCSKSARGEN

as of 09 June 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued at 4:00 PM on 29 May 2025, the weather advisory indicated partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers or thunderstorms, which may have caused flash floods or landslides during severe weather conditions across the country.

On the same day at around 2:02 PM, a sudden whirlwind or tornado struck several barangays in the Municipality of Tupi, South Cotabato. The incident caused significant damage to houses, power lines, crops, and essential lifelines.

Around 4:00 PM, continuous heavy rain and strong winds from localized thunderstorms caused flash floods in several low-lying barangays in Lambayong, Sultan Kudarat. Similarly, some barangays in Carmen, Cotabato, were also affected, resulting in the destruction of one (1) residential house.

Later, at 5:30 PM, heavy rains continued to pour in several barangays in the Municipality of Alamada, Cotabato that resulted in flooding and landslides in the affected areas.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office (FO) XII, closely coordinated with the concerned Local Government Units (LGUs) for significant updates and requests for relief augmentation, and promptly provided assistance to address the needs of the affected individuals.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,574 families** or **7,784 persons** are affected in **25 barangays** in **Region XII** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **six (6) families** or **40 persons** sought temporary shelter at the **Barangay Bao Evacuation Center** in **Alamada, North Cotabato** (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **210 houses** were damaged; of which, **10** are **totally damaged** and **200** are **partially damaged** in **Lambayong**, **Sultan Kudarat** (see Annex C).



V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance

A total of ₱1,439,252.80 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which,₱1,243,411.00 from DSWD and ₱195,841.80 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex D).
