

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon as of 10 June 2025. 6AM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 06 June 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon.


On the same day, at around 3:00 PM, a flash flood incident occurred in several barangays in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by Southwest Monsoon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **4,633 families** or **15,971 persons** are affected in **38 barangays** in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of 1,180 families or 4,189 persons sought temporary shelter in 16 evacuation centers in Regions III and IX (see Annex B).



b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **122 families** or **605 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **122 families** or **605 persons** still displaced in **Region IX** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 71 houses were partially damaged in Regions III and IX (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱2,051,275.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱2,017,030.00 from DSWD and ₱34,245.00 from the Local Government Unit (LGU) (see Annex F).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱162.03 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱6 million available at DSWD FOs III and IX.
- ₱41.02 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 756,802 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 433,294 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 323,508 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 451,600 FFPs available at DSWD FOs III and IX.
- 1,790,884 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Effects of Southwest Monsoon through inter-FO augmentation.

DSWD FO III closely coordinates with the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) to monitor and gather reports related to the effects of Southwest Monsoon.
