

DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Low Pressure Area (LPA) as of 11 June 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 05 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the Trough of Low Pressure Area (LPA) might have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in the rest of Visayas and Mindanao. On the same day, some low-lying barangays in Aleosan, North Cotabato experienced a flash flood due to heavy rains brought by the trough of LPA.

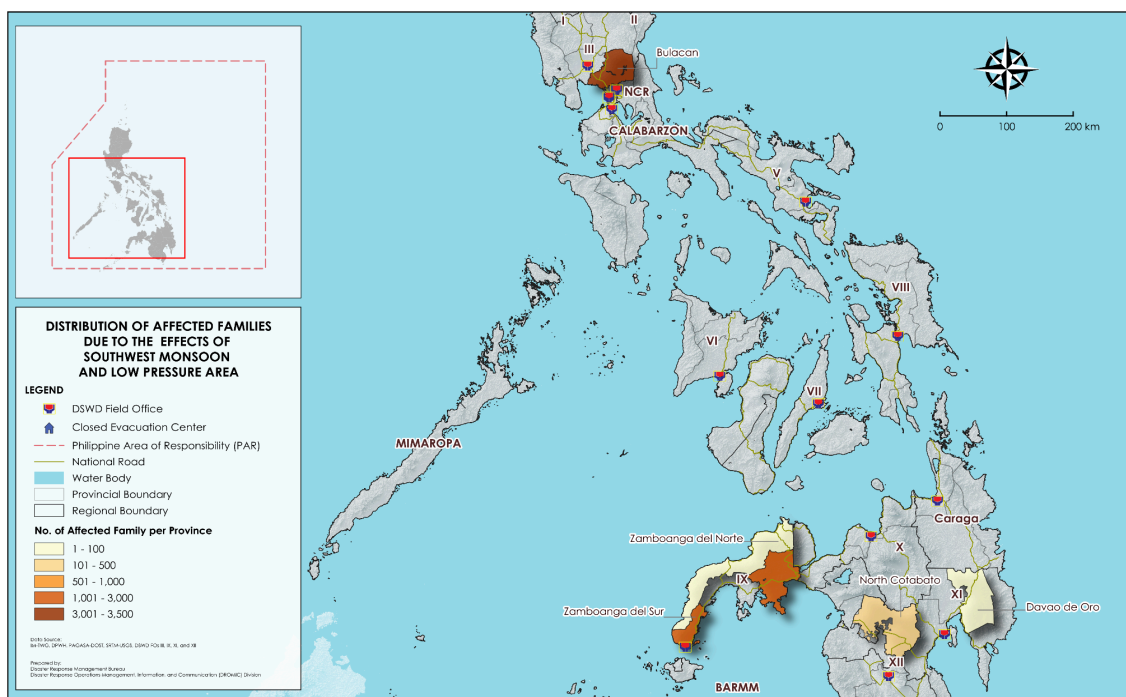
On 06 June 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon might have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon. On the same day at around 3:00 PM, a flash flood occurred in several barangays in San Jose Del Monte, Bulacan. Further, a landslide caused by LPA also occurred in Brgy. Tagbaros, Maco, Davao de Oro.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by Southwest Monsoon and LPA.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **4,791 families** or **16,436 persons** are affected in **41 barangays** in **Regions III, IX, XI, and XII** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **1,180 families** or **4,189 persons** sought temporary shelter in **16 evacuation centers** in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **three (3) families** or **10 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **three (3) families** or **10 persons** still displaced in **Region IX** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **71 houses** were **partially damaged** in **Regions III** and **IX** (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱2,180,029.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱2,145,784.00** from **DSWD** and **₱34,245.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)** (see Annex F).
