

DSWD DROMIC Report #11 on the Combined Effects of Southwest Monsoon, Severe Tropical Storm "Crising" and Low Pressure Area (LPA)

as of 22 July 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 July 2025 at 11:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) developed into Tropical Depression (TD) "Crising" while moving east of Catanduanes. By 5:00 PM, TD "Crising" continued to move west southwestward over the east of Catanduanes. By 11:00 PM, TD "Crising" slightly intensified while moving northwestward over the sea east of Bicol Region. In addition, the Southwest Monsoon also brought moderate to intense rainfall over the rest of the country. Meanwhile, the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) brought moderate to heavy rainfall across much of the Philippines

On 17 July 2025 at 5:00 AM, TD "Crising" maintained its strength while moving west Northwestward over the sea east of Bicol Region. By 11:00 AM, TD "Crising" maintained its strength as it turned north northwestward over the sea east of Catanduanes. By 5:00 PM, TD "Crising" maintained its strength while meandering over the sea east of Aurora. By 11:00 PM, TD "Crising" maintained its strength as it moved towards Northern Luzon. The monsoon remained active, delivering widespread moderate to intense rains.

On 18 July 2025 at 2:00 AM, TD "Crising" slightly accelerated as it maintained its strength over the sea east of Aurora. By 5:00 AM, TD "Crising" intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) as it approached Northern Luzon. By 8:00 AM, TS "Crising" maintained its strength as it moved northwestward towards mainland Cagayan – Babuyan Islands. By 11:00 AM, TS "Crising" slightly intensified while moving west northwestward towards mainland Cagayan – Babuyan Islands. By 2:00 PM, TS "Crising" maintained its strength as it moved north northwestward towards mainland Cagayan – Babuyan Islands. By 5:00 PM, stormy conditions are imminent over northern Luzon tonight as TS "Crising" approached northern Cagayan. By 8:00 PM, TS "Crising" maintained its strength while passing close to Santa Ana, Cagayan. By 11:00 PM, TS "Crising" maintained its strength and was over the coastal waters of Calayan, Cagayan. The monsoon remained active, delivering widespread moderate to intense rains.

On 19 July 2025 at 2:00 AM, TS "Crising" slightly intensified as it continued to traverse the coastal waters of Calayan, Cagayan. By 5:00 AM, TS "Crising" maintained its strength while moving away from extreme Northern Luzon. By 11:00 AM, TS "Crising" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) and now outside the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). By 5:00 PM, STS "Crising" maintains its strength while moving away from the Philippine landmass.

Meanwhile, the effects of Southwest Monsoon continue to bring intense rainfall over the rest of the country.

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **1,474 houses** were damaged; of which, **402** are **totally damaged** and **1,072** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, CALABARZON, V, VI, VII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga** and **CAR** (see Annex H).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱131,660,445.60** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱120,957,631.60** from **DSWD**, **₱10,674,303.12** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱5,000.00** from **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱23,510.88** from **Other Partners** (See Annex I).

The Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) remains on Red Alert status to ensure continuous monitoring and dissemination of significant disaster-related updates, in close coordination with DSWD FOs for the implementation of preparedness and readiness measures, and with Department of Science and Technology – Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST-PAGASA) for timely and accurate weather forecasts and advisories. The DRMB closely coordinates with DOST-PAGASA for significant weather updates and other related information relative to the effects of Southwest Monsoon and STS “Crising”. All DRMB QRT members and emergency equipment are on standby and ready for deployment. The National Logistics and Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as needed. The NRLMB continuously repacks goods for possible relief augmentation. The DRMB conducted a coordination meeting with the FOs to strengthen disaster reporting and social protection delivery to the affected families and individuals by the effects of Southwest Monsoon and STS “Crising”.
