

## **DSWD DROMIC Report #16 on the Combined Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Tropical Cyclones “Crising”, “Dante” and “Emong” as of 25 July 2025, 6AM**

### **I. Situation Overview**

On 16 July 2025 at 11:00 AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) developed into Tropical Depression (TD) “Crising” while moving east of Catanduanes. By 5:00 PM, TD “Crising” continued to move west southwestward over the east of Catanduanes. By 11:00 PM, TD “Crising” slightly intensified while moving northwestward over the sea east of Bicol Region. In addition, the Southwest Monsoon also brought moderate to intense rainfall over the rest of the country. Meanwhile, the Southwest Monsoon (Habagat) brought moderate to heavy rainfall across much of the Philippines.

On 17 July 2025, TD “Crising” maintained its strength throughout the day as it tracked over the waters east of Luzon. At 5:00 AM, it moved west Northwestward over the sea east of Bicol Region. At 11:00 AM, it turned north northwestward over the sea east of Catanduanes. At 5:00 PM, TD “Crising” continued to meander east of Aurora without significant change in intensity. At 11:00 PM, it persisted as it moved towards Northern Luzon. Meanwhile, the Southwest Monsoon remained active, delivering widespread moderate to intense rains.

On 18 July 2025 at 2:00 AM, TD “Crising” slightly accelerated while maintaining its strength over the sea east of Aurora. At 5:00 AM, it intensified into a Tropical Storm (TS) as it approached Northern Luzon. At 8:00 AM, TS “Crising” maintained its strength while moving northwestward towards mainland Cagayan – Babuyan Islands. At 11:00 AM, it slightly intensified as it tracked west northwestward towards mainland Cagayan – Babuyan Islands. At 2:00 PM, it maintained its strength while continuing a north northwestward movement towards mainland Cagayan – Babuyan Islands. At 5:00 PM, stormy conditions were imminent over northern Luzon as it approached northern Cagayan. At 8:00 PM, it maintained its strength as it passed close to Santa Ana, Cagayan. At 11:00 PM, TS “Crising” remained steady as it moved over the coastal waters of Calayan, Cagayan. The Southwest Monsoon remained active, delivering widespread moderate to intense rains.

On 19 July 2025, TS “Crising” continued to affect the northernmost parts of the country before exiting the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). At 2:00 AM, it slightly intensified as it continued to traverse the coastal waters of Calayan, Cagayan. At 5:00 AM, it maintained its strength while moving away from extreme Northern Luzon. At 11:00 AM, TS “Crising” intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm (STS) and exited the PAR. At 5:00 PM, STS “Crising” maintained its strength while moving away from the Philippine landmass.

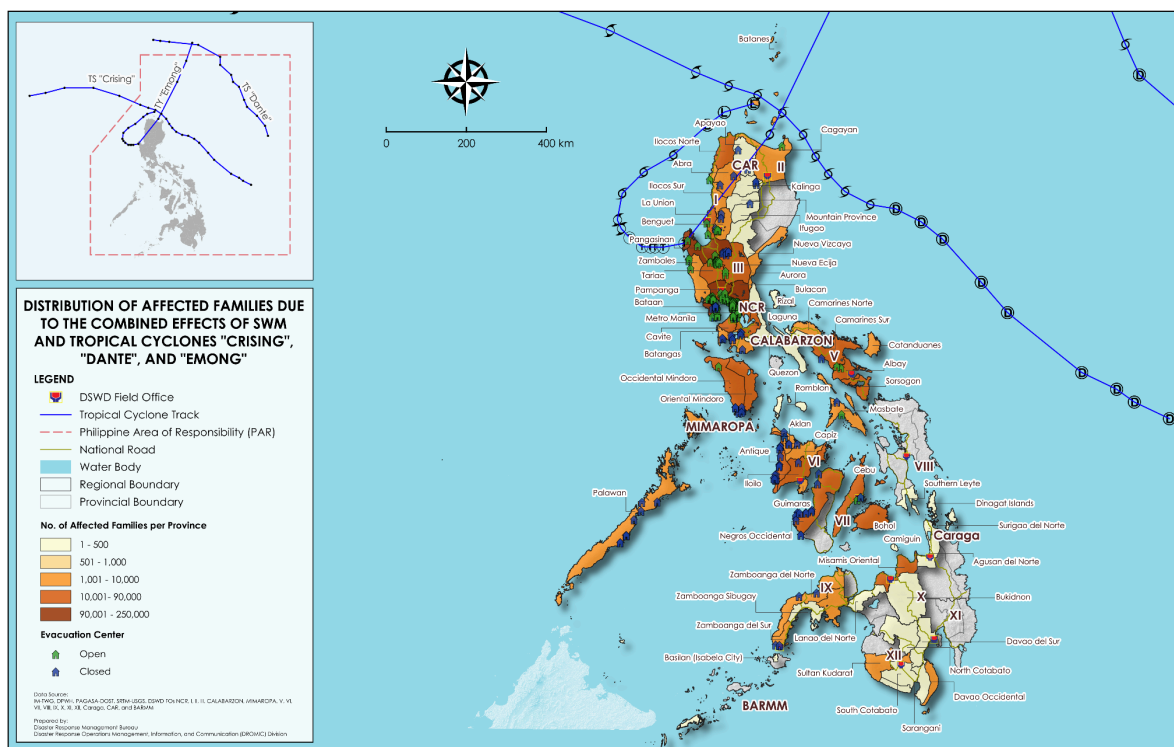
On 22 July 2025, at 5:00 PM, an LPA east of Aurora developed into TD and was named “Dante” while moving north westward at 20 km/hour. On 23 July 2025 at around 11:00 AM, “Dante” intensified into a TS. On the same day, another LPA west of Babuyan Islands developed into a TD moving west southwestward at 35/hour. Meanwhile, the effects of Southwest Monsoon continue to bring intense rainfall over the rest of the country. On 24 July 2025, at 5:00 PM, TS “Dante” exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

On 25 July 2025, Typhoon “Emong” accelerates and is about to make landfall in Ilocos Sur or the Northern Portion of La Union. The center of Typhoon “Emong” was estimated based on all available data over the coastal waters of Bangar, La Union (16.9 °N, 120.3 °E ) moving

A total of **1,380,087 families** or **4,934,207 persons** are affected in **5,501 barangays** in **Regions National Capital Region (NCR), I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, Negros Island Region (NIR), VII, VIII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga, Bangsamoro Administrative Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM), and Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR)** (see Annex A).

### a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **53,132 families** or **189,346 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **1,609 evacuation centers (ECs)** in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, NIR, VII, Caraga, and CAR** (see Annex B).

### **b. Outside Evacuation Center**

There are **24,412 families** or **94,404 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex F).

### c. Total Displaced Population

There are **77,544 families** or **286,798 persons** still displaced in **Regions NCR, I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, NIR, VII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga, CAR, and BARMM** (see Annex G).

## IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **2,286 houses** were damaged; of which, **475** are **totally damaged** and **1,812** are **partially damaged** in **Regions I, II, III, CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, V, VI, NIR, VII, IX, X, XI, XII, Caraga, CAR, and BARMM** (see Annex H).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱321,925,251.77** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱293,954,860.46** from **DSWD**, **₱16,148,828.91** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱1,314,730.00** from **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)**, and **₱10,944,882.40** from **Other Partners** (see Annex I).

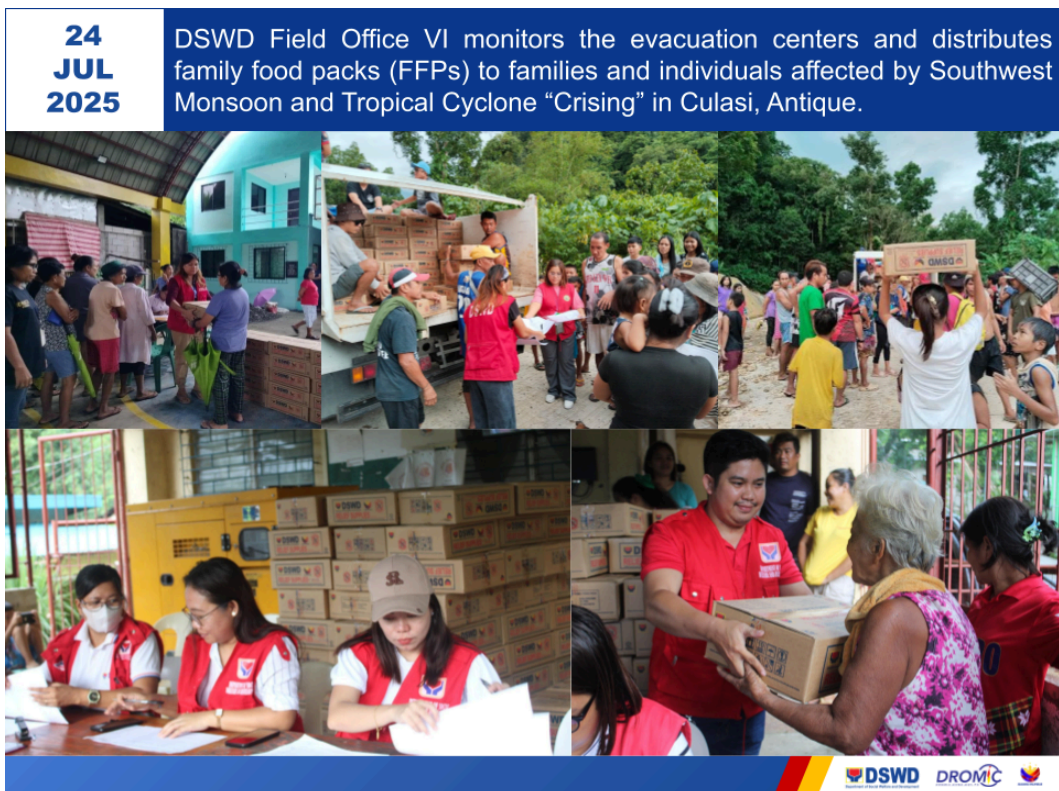
