

DSWD DROMIC Report #17 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Low Pressure Area (LPA) as of 04 July 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 05 June 2025 at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rain and thunderstorms caused by the trough of a Low Pressure Area (LPA) might have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in the rest of Visayas and Mindanao. On the same day, some low-lying barangays in Aleosan, North Cotabato experienced a flash flood due to heavy rains brought by the trough of the LPA.

On 06 June 2025 at around 4:00 AM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms caused by the Southwest Monsoon might have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Luzon. On the same day, at around 3:00 PM, a flash flood occurred in several barangays in San Jose del Monte, Bulacan. Furthermore, a landslide caused by the LPA occurred in Brgy. Tagbaros, Maco, Davao de Oro. Flooding incidents also occurred in several barangays in Balatan and Buhi, Camarines Sur due to the effects of LPA.

On 07 June 2025 at around 11:40 AM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to heavy rainfall caused by the combined effects of the Southwest Monsoon and LPA.

On 08 June 2025 at around 6:00 AM, strong winds and large waves were experienced along the coastal barangay of Ortiz, Iloilo City caused by the Southwest Monsoon.

On 10 June 2025, several barangays in Cagayan de Oro City experienced flash floods and landslides due to light to moderate rainfall caused by the Southwest Monsoon. On the same day, strong winds occurred in Brgy. Bunga, Salvador Benedicto, Negros Occidental, caused by the Southwest Monsoon.
