

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City

as of 07 July 2025, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 05 July 2025 at around 11:19 AM, a fire incident occurred at Block 27 A&C and Block 29 Baltaw Street, Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 2:37 PM. Due to the incident, 2,061 individuals were affected and caused significant damage to their houses.

In response, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), through its Field Office National Capital Region (FO NCR), is currently facilitating the relief augmentation request in close coordination with the Local Government Unit (LGU) of Mandaluyong City.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **527 families** or **2,061 persons** are affected in **Brgy. Addition Hills**, **Mandaluyong City** (see Annex A).

III. Status of Displaced Population

Inside Evacuation Center

There are 527 families or 2,061 persons currently taking temporary shelter in a permanent evacuation center in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City (see Annex B).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of 233 houses were totally damaged in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City (see Annex C).
