
I. Situation Overview

Issued on 04 July 2025, at 5:00 PM, "Bising" has exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

HAZARDS AFFECTING LAND AREAS

Heavy Rainfall Outlook

Refer to Weather Advisory issued No. 11 at 5:00 PM today for the heavy rainfall outlook due to Tropical Depression BISING and the Southwest



Severe Winds

Monsoon.

The southwest monsoon and the periphery of BISING will also bring strong to gale-force gusts over the following areas (especially in coastal and upland areas exposed to winds):

- Today (4 July): Ilocos Region, Isabela, the northern portion of Aurora, Zambales, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Palawan, and Antique.
- Tomorrow (5 July): the rest of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Isabela, the northern portion of Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Cavite, Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Palawan, and Antique.
- Sunday (6 July): the rest of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union, Pangasinan, Isabela, the northern portion of Aurora, Zambales, Bataan, Metro Manila, Cavite, Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Palawan, and Antique.

HAZARDS AFFECTING COASTAL WATERS

24-Hour Sea Condition Outlook

Up to rough seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 3.0 m: The western seaboards of Babuyan Islands and Ilocos Norte.
- Mariners of small seacrafts, including all types of motorbancas, are advised not to venture out to sea under these conditions, especially if inexperienced or operating ill-equipped vessels.



Up to moderate seas over the following coastal waters:

- Up to 2.5 m: The northwestern seaboard of llocos Sur and the seaboard of Batanes.
- Up to 2.0 m: The western seaboards of La Union and Pangasinan, the remaining seaboard of llocos Sur.
- Mariners of motorbancas and similarly-sized vessels are advised to take precautionary measures while venturing out to sea and, if possible, avoid navigation under these conditions.

TRACK AND INTENSITY OUTLOOK


- Tropical Storm "Bising" is forecast to move north northwestward tonight through tomorrow morning before turning north northeastward over the sea west of Extreme Northern Luzon. Re-entry to the western boundary of the PAR is possible by Monday (07 July) early morning and it may exit again the northern boundary of PAR on Monday afternoon.
- "Bising" intensified into a tropical storm at 8:00 PM today. Further intensification is possible and it may reach severe tropical storm category by Sunday (06 July).

The center of Tropical Depression BISING was estimated based on all available data at 345 km West Northwest of Calayan, Cagayan (19.7°N, 118.2°E).

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 903 families or 2,520 persons are affected in eight (8) barangays in Regions I, III and CAR (see Annex A).





III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **four (4) families** or **18 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **Brgy. Hall of Brgy. Rajal Centro** in **Santa Rosa, Nueva Ecija** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

There are **604 families** or **1,786 persons** temporarily staying with their relatives or friends (see Annex C).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **608 families** or **1,804 persons** still displaced in **Regions III** and **CAR** (see Annex D).

IV. Damaged Houses

One (1) house was totally damaged in Brgy. Patrocinio (Poblacion), San Narciso, Zambales (see Annex E).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **P79,773.57** worth of assistance was provided by the **Local Government Units** (**LGUs**) to the affected families (see Annex F).

a. Standby Funds

- ₱93.82 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱15 million available at DSWD FOs I, II, III, CALABARZON, and Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR).
- ₱33 million available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Southwest Monsoon and TD "Bising" through inter-FO augmentation.

- 714,136 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 326,085 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 388,051 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 848,057 FFPs available at DSWD FOs I, II, III, CALABARZON, and CAR.
- 1,473,961 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs, which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of Southwest Monsoon and TD "Bising" through inter-FO augmentation.

National Logistics and Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as needed. NRLMB continuously repacks goods for possible augmentation.
