

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) as of 02 July 2025, 6AM

I. Situation Overview

On June 20, 2025, at around 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms, brought about by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), might have brought flash floods or landslides due to moderate to heavy rains in Mindanao, Western Visayas, Negros Island Region, and Palawan. On the same day, a strong wind incident associated with the prevailing effects of the ITCZ occurred in Brgy. Granada, Bacolod City, Negros Occidental, where a tree to fall and completely destroyed a residential structure.

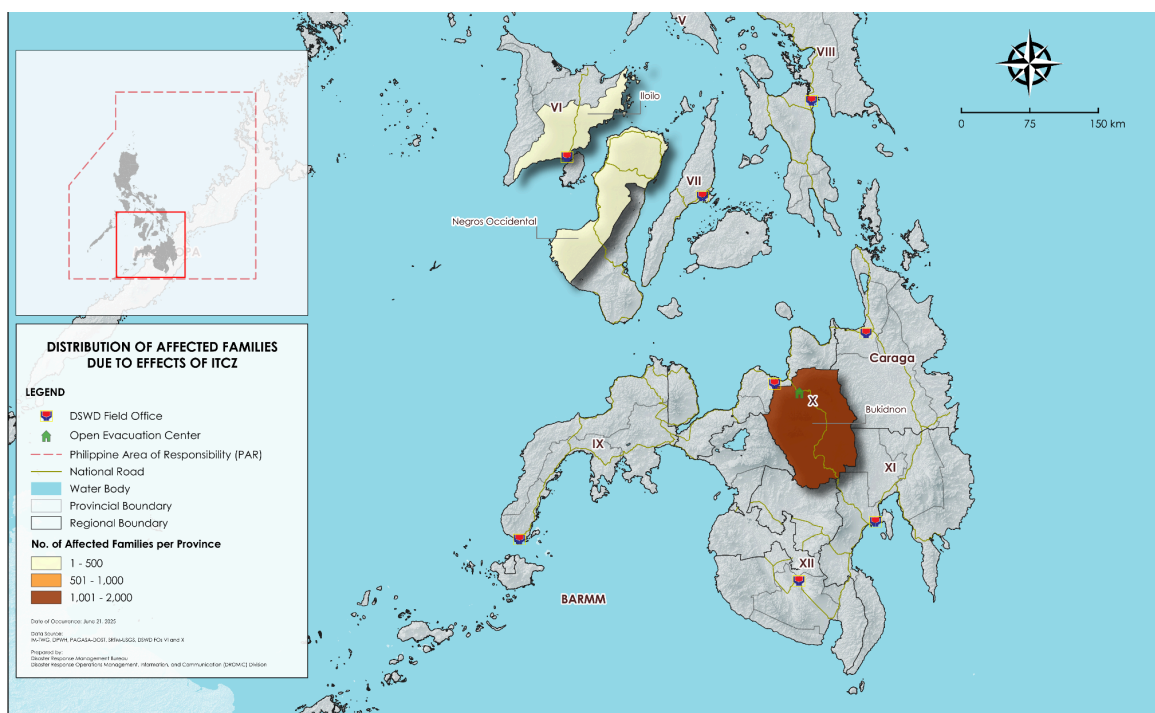
On 21 June 2025, at around 4:00 PM, several barangays in the City of Valencia, Bukidnon experienced flash floods and landslides due to continuous heavy rains brought about by the prevailing ITCZ. On the same day at around 3:30 PM, the municipality of Badiangan, Iloilo experienced continuous heavy rain accompanied by strong winds also brought about by ITCZ.

On 25 June 2025, Malaybalay City also reported flooding and landslide incidents affecting seven (7) of its barangays, attributed to the same weather condition.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,893 families** or **7,901 persons** are affected in **15 barangays** in **Regions VI and X** (see Annex A).



III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are **eight (8) families** or **34 persons** currently taking temporary shelter at the **covered court** in **Brgy. Tankulan, Manolo Fortich, Bukidnon** (see Annex B).

b. Outside Evacuation Center

A total of **two (2) families** or **five (5) persons** temporarily stayed with their relatives or friends (see Annex D).

c. Total Displaced Population

There are **eight (8) families** or **34 persons** still displaced in **Region X** (see Annex E).

IV. Damaged Houses

A total of **six (6) houses** were **damaged**; of which, **one (1)** was **totally damaged** and **five (5)** were **partially damaged** in **Regions VI and X** (see Annex F).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱73,452.00** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱9,162.00** from **DSWD** and **₱64,290.00** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)** (see Annex G).
